The founding Head of Middle School will play a central role in building and refining an innovative program that emphasizes experiential learning, robust enrichment opportunities, and meaningful community collaborations. The Head of Middle School will lead initiatives to support diverse middle school learners and ensure students have a pathway to success in high school. This vital leadership role will require building strong partnerships with families, community organizations, and with private and public school leaders. The Head of Middle School will report directly to the Head of School and empower middle school faculty by providing direction, mentorship, coaching, and evaluation. Successful candidates will have experience in middle school education, program development, and school leadership.

- Recruit, hire, mentor, evaluate, and support highly qualified middle school faculty
- Provide visionary leadership for the growth and development of the middle school division
- Design and support innovative, experiential learning, inquiry-based instruction, and real-world applications for middle school students
- Contribute to school strategic planning, priorities, and continuous development efforts
- Collaborate with other division heads and the Head of School to ensure alignment and continuity
- Oversee middle school student life, advising, social-emotional learning, and character development
- Support admissions, re-enrollment, and orientation efforts for middle school students in partnership with the Admissions Director
- Lead and facilitate middle school faculty meetings, professional development, and grade level meetings
- Utilize appropriate metrics and data to evaluate student progress
- Serve as an ambassador for the middle school within the broader school community
