Dear Parents,

Welcome to third grade at PHPS. We are thrilled your family will be joining our school community. Summer should be a respite for students, a time for play and an opportunity for connecting with family and friends. However, did you know that research shows students can lose up to 34% of the academic progress made during the school year? Sprinkling in some math and reading practice throughout summer will help reinforce skills attained this school year and ensure your child feels prepared and confident to start the school year. All PHPS students are expected to complete summer math and reading assignments to reinforce and strengthen learned concepts and skills. Please see the requirements below and reach out if you have any questions.

Summer Reading:

Rising third graders will read 20 books over the summer and record each title on the attached reading log. Chapter books count as 2 books. Students may record books that are listened to via an audiobook, books that are read independently, and books that are read to the student by a parent or other adult.

Summer Math:

Please see the enclosed information for the PHPS summer math assignments. If your child cannot complete a math problem, please circle the item, and your child's teacher will work with him/her on this particular concept during the first week of school. Circled items will not impact your child negatively. Students should also practice math facts at least weekly to continue building fact fluency over the summer months.

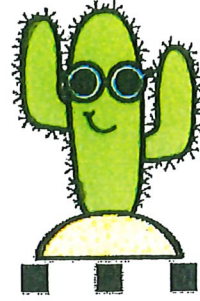
